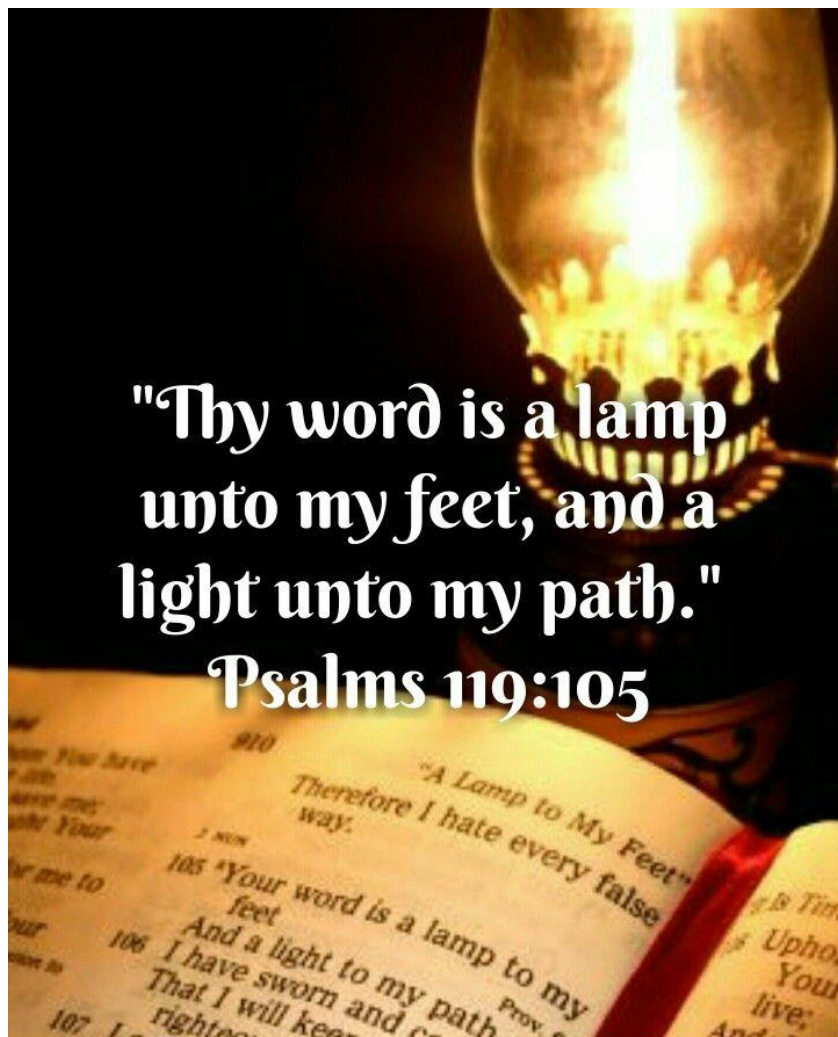

Prelude

Call to Worship (from Psalm 99, adapted from the Inclusive Bible translation)

Unison Prayer of Confession
